

Parshas Vayeitzei - We Need Chizuk!

When Yaakov slept on Har Hamoriah, he had a dream of angels going up and down a ladder. The Ramban's pshat in the dream is that Hashem was telling Yaakov that Hashem's mission on earth is carried out by angels, but still, Hashem is "nitzav alav" - meaning that Hashem is the One controlling the angels and all that they do. Then Hashem says to Yaakov but you are "Chailek Hashem" and will protect you personally without any angels.

One may ask - why does *Hashem* need to tell *Yaakov that Hashem controls the malochim*? Did *Yaakov n*ot know that *Hashem* runs the world? Did he think that angels could just go around doing whatever they want?

It would seem that the reason why *Hashem* needed to be *Michazeik Yakov* was because when *Hashem* is about to tell him that Yakov himself will be so protected by *Hashem*, it could on an emotional level give Yakov the feeling that the world and others don't have the same exact hashgacha and control by *Hashem*, perhaps *Hashem* on some level allowed the angels to decide the destiny of everyone else; *Hashem*, therefore, was *michazeik Yaakov* that the world is under the full control of *Hashem* and the *malochim* are only allowed to fulfill His will exactly. We see from here that while of course we know that Hashem protects *Tzadikim* and we even at times seek their Blessings, at the same time we need to be *michazeik* ourselves to fully understand, even emotionally that our lives are fully controlled by the merciful hand of Hakadosh Baruch Hu.
